- [] **Kiln-glass** (or **kilnforming**) is glass formed in a kiln, usually at temperatures between ~1250 – 1600°F. What can you find that is made with **kilnformed** glass? How can you tell?
- [] **Transparent** objects allow light to pass through so that items behind can be seen. An **opaque** object stops light from passing through, making it impossible to see through. Find three transparent artworks and three opaque. What colors are they?
- [] Find an artwork with an interesting **shape**. What do you like about? Why? What does it remind you of?
- [] Artists often use black and white values in their work. A **value** is the measurement of how dark or light something is. Find artworks that represent the darkest side of the value scale and the lightest side.
- [] Find the touching table. Can you tell which samples are like artworks in the exhibition? How can you tell?

- [] Artists often use repetition in their work. **Repetition** refers to one object or shape being repeated to create a final work of art. Choose your favorite shape in an artwork and then make a drawing by repeating the shape on the back of this sheet.
- [] Find the glass panels activity. Create your own artwork by layering panels together.
- [] Find the drawing activity. Select an inspiration card and create a drawing based on the word you choose. Hang it on the wall.
